Ice Cream Van

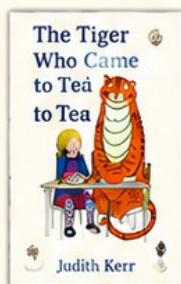

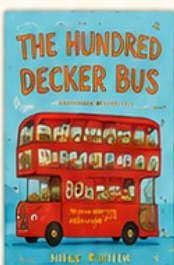

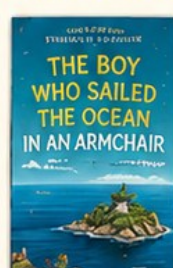
