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Cherry Class

This autumn term will be full of thrills, excitement and fireworks in Cherry Class!

Our history topic is The Great Fire of London. The children will delve into the diary of Samuel Pepys and explore what life was like during the fire. In literacy, our focus this half term will be the story of The Enormous Turnip, learning actions to help retell the story and develop sentence-writing skills. The children will be excited about science through our Animal Safari topic. As we learn about a variety of animals, explore their different habitats, and discover how they have adapted to survive in their environments. We are also delighted to be welcoming a coach from Luctonians this half term, who will be helping us to develop and improve our throwing and catching skills.

We look forward to getting to know our new Reception children and learning more about their interests, as we help them settle into their new routines.

Cherry Class will be a busy environment of Reception and Year One children and we are looking forward to a fun-filled term of learning, discovery and adventure!

Willow Class

We are very excited to welcome Willow class children back to school and have a wonderful half term of learning, fun and new experiences planned together. Our History topic this half term is the Great Fire of London, which is always a firm favourite with the children. In English, we will be bringing our learning to life with a virtual visit to Pudding Lane, where we will bake our own bread before writing our own set of accompanying instructions. We are also really looking forward to our team-building trip to Tiny Town in a couple of weeks. You may notice some new equipment outside our classroom; we are hoping to make the most of our outdoor area this year, weather permitting, with lots of exciting opportunities for play, exploration and learning. We can't wait to get started and look forward to a fantastic half term ahead!

Larch Class

This term, we will be travelling back in time to explore The Stone Age in Larch Class. We will discover how people survived during this fascinating period, how their knowledge and skills evolved, and how we can use evidence to learn about the past. We will become historians as we investigate different sources and try to answer the intriguing question: Why was Stonehenge built? Our whole-class reading book will be the wonderful Stone Age Boy, which will inspire us to write our own exciting portal stories, taking our characters on adventures between the modern world and the Stone Age. Alongside our history and English learning, we will also be enjoying Dance with Miss Izzy on Mondays, giving us plenty of opportunities to get creative and active! We will also be learning our times tables each day.

Redwood Class

This half term in Redwood we are focussing on the World Wars. Our class book is Private Peaceful by Michael Morpurgo, which is based on WWI and will be studied alongside our history focus which is World War II and local history. We will be looking at how the local area was impacted by WWII, with a specific look into the involvement of Shobdon airfield. During English we will be linking our genres of descriptive historical settings, informal letters and an explanation text to passages from Private Peaceful and using our VIPER skills during whole class reading. We will be starting the new school year with place value in maths and moving onto the four operations. Our science focus for the half term is 'Light', with investigations into how light travels and how we observe it. On a Wednesday we are very much looking forward to welcoming Luctonians Rugby Club in for tag rugby coaching and taking part in intra and inter-school competitions. We have lots of exciting events to look forward to so Autumn 2026 promises to be a fantastic few weeks!
